School services in Church are an interesting experience. Parents often stand up and wave to their children to reassure them that they are there and ready to watch. 'Look at me!' is not just a childlike trait - many adults want reassurance too, in order to eliminate self-doubt.

John the Baptist (patron saint of three parishes in our benefice) was in prison and had plenty of time to reflect on his life. Had he been mistaken? Was he really the one chosen to prepare the way for the Messiah? Should he not have spoken out criticising Herod's irregular marriage? Perhaps he was not expecting to lose his life, but had he wasted it? He needed reassurance even though he was Jesus' second cousin! Jesus replied, quoting one of the greatest Old Testament prophets - one of two, or possibly three who were called Isaiah - about the blind, the deaf, together with many others, being healed. Also, about the Spirit of the Lord from Isaiah 61.

We all have doubts throughout our spiritual pilgrimage. Having tried to inspire hope at funerals over 55 years, will I be so certain when my own comes along? We all have our barren periods, but if we spend a moment to reflect, we will find that many blessings have been received, guidance given in tricky situations, prayers answered, and sins forgiven. This brings reassurance, so that we can look forward in hope.

In the words of the old hymn - 'Count your blessings.....and it will surprise you what the Lord has done.' *Martin.*
