O Lord, raise up, we pray, your power and come among us, and with great might succour us; that whereas, through our sins and wickedness we are grievously hindered in running the race that is set before us, your bountiful grace and mercy may speedily help and deliver us; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit, be honour and glory, now and for ever.

Readings

Old Testament Isaiah 11. 1-10.

New Testament Romans 15. 4-13. Gospel Matthew 3. 1-12.

Those of you who have been unfortunate enough to have been stuck in a conversation with me about the Book of Common Praver will know that I am a very big fan of the "old style" of church worship. One of the great joys of the Prayer Book, I think, is the rich and poetic language that it uses; and this is perhaps most clear in its Collects throughout the church's liturgical year. This week's, the Second Sunday after Advent, is one of my favourites: "Blessed Lord, who hast caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning; Grant that we may in such wise hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that by patience and comfort of thy holy Word, we may embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life, which thou hast given us in our Saviour Jesus Christ." When David and I say Morning and Evening prayer together around the parishes this week, as we do every day, we will say that repeat that Collect each time. It is through repetition, and the meditation that it allows, that we can "meet again" the same words and phrases. New ideas jump out at us, or perhaps the words ring true in a way that they haven't before. I know that, as I approach this week, I will be left wondering about the ways in which I can "hear, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest" all that is going on around me. Life is much like scripture in the round, and we can see the redemptive work of God in all that we do – after all, it is in Him that we live and move and have our being (Acts 17.28), as it is for all of humanity. Let us, then, seek the Word of God not only in our study of scripture, but in our lives and our actions. Think this week of the ways in which you are able to draw near to God, of the opportunities that He has given you to grow in relationship with Him – and mark, learn, and inwardly digest those means by which He shows His love and His grace to you.
