The news recently has been dominated by two stories; Gaza and Prince Andrew. On the basis that the former will be with us for some time and the latter will fizzle out soon, I feel bound to consider the latter first. You might not be a red-hot royal enthusiast but the story is still a gripping one.

To some extent Andrew became the victim of a Mr Epstein who made it his business to procure young girls for his own use and the use of others whom he favoured. He ended up in prison and in due course took his own life. He had become friends with Andrew and allegedly provided "interest" for him, unfortunately young, and the "interest" grew up, has written an autobiography, and alas has also taken her own life. Andrew has paid the price in that he has had to relinquish his royal honours and titles but as I write not his accommodation and income, though it is hard to see how his future will pan out.

This country cherishes its Royal Family. It is a continuity with the past and the study of its historic adventures is in itself fascinating. Actual governing power has passed to Parliament but is exercised in the name of the monarch. Many find this an agreeable outcome of history and a moderating influence. Our God is a forgiving God, a fact that Andrew will find important in time to come. This fact is a reminder for us all, one that we need to remember with adequate frequency, and be glad to embrace.
